Ceremony Held in Garden of  
Home of Mr. and Mrs. F. P.  
King in Irvington, N. Y.

## BISHOP LLOYD OFFICIATES

Bride Escorted by Her Brother, E.  
B. Katte—Miss Edward R. God-  
frey Is Matron of Honor.

Miss Elizabeth Katte, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Britton Katte, was married to Henry Merwin Shradly, elder son of Mrs. Henry Merwin Shradly of Elmsford, N. Y., and the late Mr. Shradly yesterday at the home of her uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. Frederick P. King in Irvington, N. Y. Owing to the serious illness of the bride's grandmother, Mrs. Walter Katte, only the immediate members of the two families and a few intimate friends were present at the ceremony, which was performed in the garden by the Right Rev. Arthur Selden Lloyd, Suffragan Bishop of the diocese of New York.

The bride was escorted by her brother, Edwin Britton Katte, who gave her in marriage. She wore a princess gown of ivory-colored satin, sleeveless and embellished with a wide bertha of old rose-point lace that outlined the low, square neck. Her veil of exquisite old rose-point lace, loaned to her by her cousin, Mrs. Charlton MacVeagh, had been worn at the wedding of Empress Eugénie of France by the wife of the American Minister to Japan at that time. The veil was arranged with a snug fitting cap of the lace, and held in place with a narrow bandeau of orange blossoms. The bridal bouquet was of white orchids and lilies-of-the-valley.

Mrs. Edward Rawson Godfrey was matron of honor and the bride's only attendant. She wore a costume of white chiffon with a hat to correspond and carried a bouquet of crimson roses.

Frederick Charles Shradly was best man for his brother. There were no ushers.

A small reception followed the ceremony after which Mr. Shradly and his bride left on their wedding trip to Canada. They will live in Elmsford, N. Y. The bride is a granddaughter of the late Thomas M. King, vice president of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad, and of the late Walter Katte, for many years chief engineer of the New York Central Railroad. Her father was chief engineer of the electric traction of the latter railroad at the time of his death. She is a niece of Mrs. Edwin Godfrey Merrill of this city and Bedford Hills, N. Y. Mr. Shradly is a grandson of the late Dr. George F. Shradly of this city. His father was the well known sculptor.
